Things for Researchers to Keep in Mind in Using the Archives

- 1. Pens are not allowed in the research room. Researchers will be provided with a pencil. Coats are to be hung in the provided closet.
- 2. Researchers are not allowed in the stacks area. A few boxes at a time will be brought out. Researchers may not rearrange the file order in any way.
- 3. Persons who misrepresent what they are researching will not be allowed back into the archives.
- 4. Nothing can be taken home or in any other way taken out of the archives.
- 5. A few copies can be made with no charge, however larger copying projects should be paid for.
- 6. The archivist is not a researcher, it is not the job of the archivist to do the research for someone.
- 7. The exception to number 6 is for internal projects of the province.
- 8. Parishes staffed by the province should provide at least 16 weeks notice for any research they need.
- 9. Files of deceased friars are closed for twenty years after the friar's death. Most sensitive documents are not kept in the archives but in the Provincial Office.
- 10. Any item published from the archives should carry the notice "Courtesy of the Archives, Province of Our Lady of Consolation, Conventual Franciscan Friars."
- 11. Researchers are bound by copyright laws of the United States of America.
- 12. The archival material of a living friar requires permission of that friar to be used.
